

Though Thanksgiving is typically commemorated in the Church on the Sunday immediately preceding the holiday, our music throughout the month of November will celebrate this beloved observance. The Call to Worship, *Let All Things Now Living*, written in 1939 by Katherine K. Davis, is a joyful hymn of thanksgiving that praises God as Creator, Sustainer, and Guide. It is usually sung to the popular Welsh tune, *Llwyn Oon* (The Ash Tree/Grove). This morning, the choir sings the vibrant melody, while two of our talented sopranos – Genie Loggins and Karin Callahan – soar above with a stratospheric descant. The same tune is also the basis for the Prelude, fashioned into a set of variations by American organist Mark Rippe. The Anthem, by contemporary Australian composer and teacher, Donnalyn Grunewald, pairs a gentle and understated melody with select verses of the well-known hymn, *For the Beauty of the Earth* (No. 92 in the hymnal). The result is a quiet offering of thanks.

The organ Offertory and Postlude are by the English musician John Ebenezer West (1863-1929). Though little-known today, he was a prolific composer, was organist at several important London churches, and was an influential music editor and educator. His *Passacaglia in F* sounds suspiciously similar to the infamous *Canon* by Pachelbel; in fact, it utilizes the same technique of a repeated bass (pedal) line over which varied melodic material is presented. The Postlude is a brief improvisation based on the Thanksgiving hymn, *We Plow the Fields*, which also serves as the Choral Benediction.

FEEDING FAMILIES DURING SNAP CRISIS

During the SNAP Benefits crisis, we remain committed to serving hungry individuals and families. There are several ways you can help:

- Donate Money you can do so online through our website. You can also drop money in the offering place or mail a check to the church. If you write a check, please note in the memo line that it is for "SNAP Food Support."
- Donate Food You can drop off shelf stable items at ASP Monday through Friday from 8am – 11am ... things like spaghetti, spaghetti sauce, peanut butter, jelly, rice, pop top raviolis, cans of chicken or tuna, mac and cheese, canned fruit / vegetables, shelf stable milk.
